



What is the main thing you hope readers will get from your book?

This is an up-to-date overview of the state of the art in political science and its sub-disciplines, taking a global perspective. It will be most useful for advanced B.A. students preparing for their exams and beginning M.A. students in inter-disciplinary courses who come from different backgrounds. Furthermore, professionals in the media and practitioners of politics, including NGOs, can gain valuable insights into what high quality international political science means today.

What are you most proud of about your book?

The truly broad historical and global scope, providing a pluralist perspective of empirically oriented political science. Here we can build on our experience as editors of the *International Encyclopedia of Political Science* (8 volumes, SAGE 2011) which brought together more than 600 leading contributors from all parts of the world.

Why, would you say, is it so important to move beyond the traditional approaches to political science?


For historical reasons, modern political science has been dominated to a large extent by Anglo-Saxon and especially American influences. In today's globalized world this is now changing, leading to a more comprehensive analysis of both domestic and international politics in all regions.

Furthermore, the neighbouring disciplines were not sufficiently taken into account, in particular sociology and history, which are required for understanding a global world. Therefore, we tried to promote a more transdisciplinary vision.

What top tips would you give to postgraduates approaching the study of political science for the first time?

You must be interested in current political and international affairs. In the course of time, you will gain an understanding for the complexity of these matters, but also of their relevance for humankind. You will develop a sense of orientation for your own life. Your future life is clearly located in a global world, whatever the choices you make. You have to locate yourself in this world, to try to understand it, and also to respect it as diverse and complex.

What key changes can readers expect in this new Second Edition?

This **Second Edition** of **World Politics** has both updated and re-styled the content of the first edition. Important recent developments in international affairs - such as the war against ISIS, Russian intervention in Ukraine, and the UK decision to leave the European Union - are analyzed as part of a general process to bring case studies up to date. This edition has also been revamped in terms of its constituent chapters in order to properly reflect important changes in the contemporary political world. In particular, two new chapters - on International Law and Migration - are included to reflect the increased relevance of these two areas of international relations and other chapters have been streamlined and re-focused in order to accommodate this.

What's the main thing you hope students will get from using your book?

The main thing we hope to provide students with in this **Second Edition** is a textbook that is both accessible and comprehensive. **World Politics** is intended as a broad text to guide students through a degree (or degree component) in International Relations, and as a quick reference guide to the concepts and theories of the subject to aid in their studies.

Why do you feel the study of world politics and international relations is so important?

States today are faced with unprecedented challenges. Increasing numbers of countries are acquiring nuclear weapons, adding to the thousands of such weapons already present in the world; terrorists are striking weak and strong states alike; brutal civil conflicts are breaking out across the Middle East and Africa; thousands of poverty-stricken people continue to die every day; economic migrants and refugees are pouring into other regions and neighbouring states seeking to escape war and other social ills in their own countries; and populist leaders and their supporters are poised the world over to reject globalization, throw out free trade and turn inwards.



What top tips would you give to students new to studying world politics and international relations?


Students approaching the study of world politics and international relations for the first time should:





60 SECONDS WITH NATASHA EZROW...

What's the main thing you hope readers will get from reading your book?

There are several major themes that are important for students to be aware of:

- 1) Traditional theories of conflict and violence are becoming less relevant to understanding security today
- 2) Most wars are internal, not between states
- 3) Violent non-state actors have become as important as state actors
- 4) Violent non-state actors are not just politically motivated but also economically motivated and vice versa. We see a hybridity of different groups and a grey area of violence and crime more so than ever before
- 5) Understanding security requires an inter-disciplinary approach that combines political science with sociology, psychology and criminology
- 6) We have not come up with clear definitions of different violent groups, making it harder to identify them, and to prevent their emergence and facilitate their exit.

Why do you feel it's important to study violent non-state actors?

This can be answered by the third point: violent non-state actors have become as important as states. They sometimes have similar levels of military power and judicial power; they have tremendous soft power; they have high levels of economic power; and they often offer the services that states provide, supplanting the state and undermining the state's legitimacy. They weaken and destabilize the state. They are a major cause of insecurity today.

How do you see the role of violent non-state actors changing over the next few years?

Globalization has changed the nature of violence and the structure and capacity of violent groups. They have flatter hierarchies, they are more involved in organized crime and we will see more individuals being inspired by groups and engaging in lone actor violence.

What top tips would you give to students new to the study of political violence?

It is important to be familiar with the key concepts and theories in security of the past and today. Understand how to conceptualize the various actors that you are studying. Work to understand how to define different groups, how they differ and what conclusions can be drawn. Also try to understand traditional theories of conflict and security in order to have a better grasp on how the world is changing. Finally, try to understand where other disciplines can help inform us about security, and know when a different lens may be more appropriate for achieving comprehension of a complex phenomenon.
